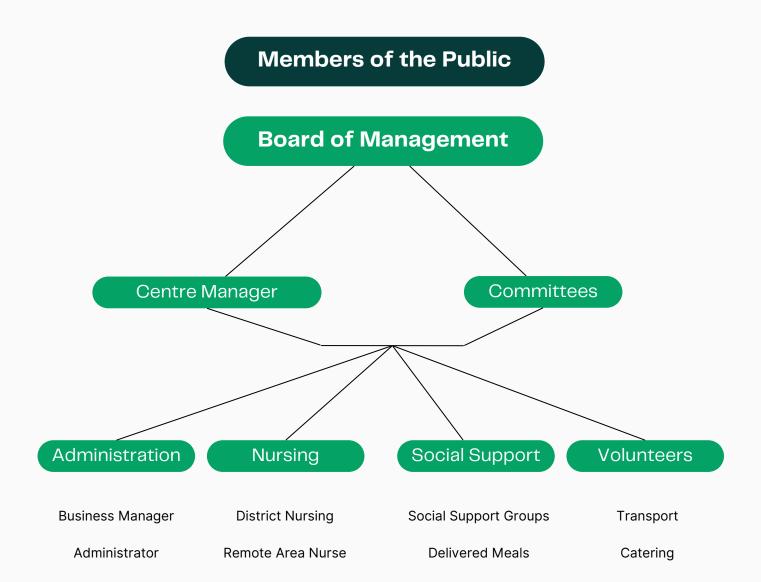
The service is governed by a dedicated and skills-based Board of Management that endorse a Centre Manager to lead the operations of the service.

Let us take these achievements as a foundation for future growth and collaboration so that we can navigate any challenges that lie ahead.



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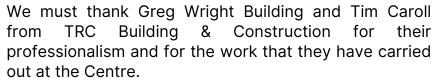

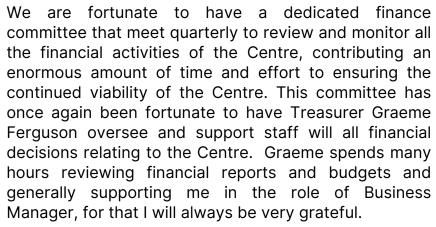

The 2023 – 2024 Financial year has seen the Elmhurst Bush Nursing Centre once again continue to move forward in a positive direction.

The primary focus for the finance committee during the last financial year has been to oversee the construction works at the front and rear of the Centre, these works made possible due to the successful grant applications submitted through the Regional Health Infrastructure Fund. The Regional Health Infrastructure Fund (RHIF) provides government funding to rural and regional health services and agencies across Victoria, enabling services to continue to provide safe and efficient care to local communities.

Elmhurst Bush Nursing were successful with submissions in the 2020-21 RHIF Round 5 RHIFR5091 and the 2022-23 RHIF — RHIF. Both of these submissions were aimed at improving the outdoor areas of the Centre, to improve infection control and to give the Centre the capacity to function during any times of unexpected disruption.

- Improvements of the facility to better meet client needs.

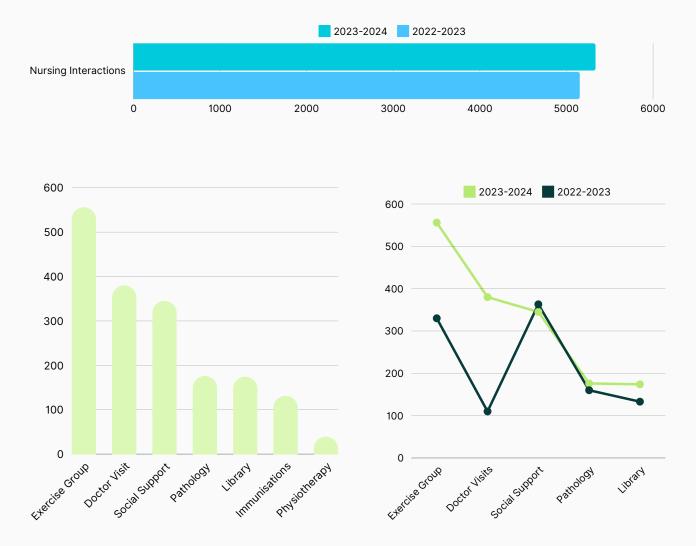
Partnering with Consumers and Collaboration

These trends present us with unique opportunities to further enhance our strategies and continue building strong relationships and other healthcare partnerships.

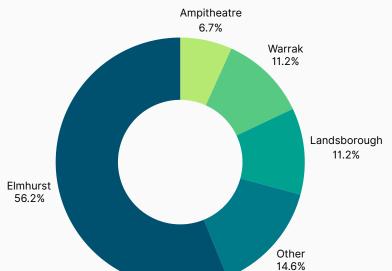


COMMUNITY SURVEY

Each year, we conduct an annual survey to gather insights from our community at the Bush Nursing Centre. This year, however, we received responses from 32 out of the 250 surveys sent out.

The communities feedback is crucial in shaping our services and ensuring we meet the needs of all our members.

Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

a) Basis of Presentation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Victoria). The Board of Management has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

b) Income Tax

The Association has a tax exempt status.

c) Property, plant and equipment

Office Equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The carrying amount of fixed assets is reviewed annually by members of the Board of Management to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of these assets.

The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows which will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining the recoverable amounts.

Land and Buildings were re-valued last financial year in line with a valuation provided by Elders Real Estate Avoca.

The depreciation amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The average depreciation rate is 20% for office equipment.

d) Revenue

Revenue is accounted for on an accrual basis when it is earned.

 For the purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and in banks and term deposit investments.

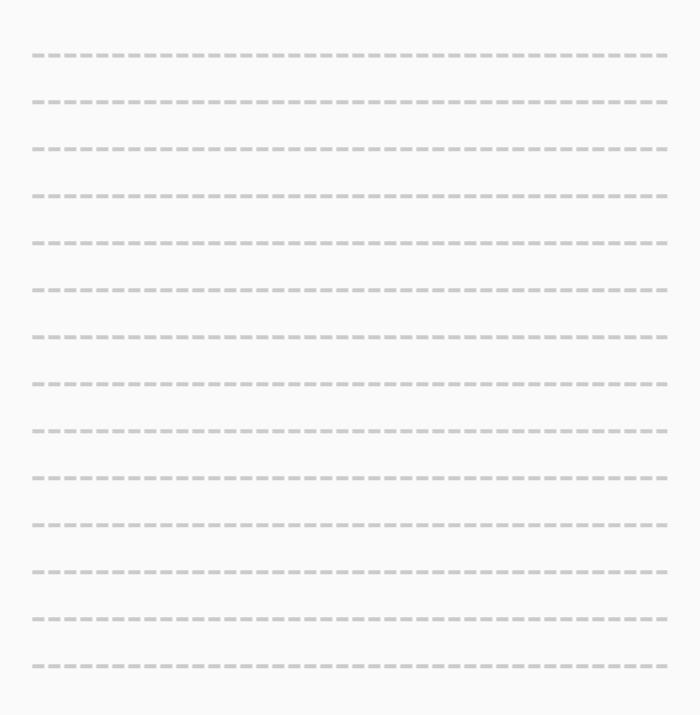
